


# NSRA

Eligibility	Teams representing the chief City of each country in the United Kingdom, and each State or Province in Australia, Canada, India, New Zealand, South Africa, Sri Lanka, and other countries in the Commonwealth.
Format	Teams of 15. Single stage competition.
Course of Fire	20 shots at 15, 20 or 25 yards or 25 metres per team member.
Targets	Short Range Rifle (1510BM, 2010BM, 2510BM, 25M10BM)
Period of Shooting	<b>Winter</b> - January to September
Special Conditions	<p>Entry forms to be requested from the Competitions Department. Each City may only enter one team.</p> <p>The team will be selected by the representative organisation in each City. Team members need not be resident in the City, but must be fully active, financial and regular members of clubs in the City for which they shoot.</p> <p>Teams must shoot their cards on the same range during the period of any one week (Monday-Sunday inclusive). The cards for each team member must be completed in 2 hours.</p> <p>Cards must be returned to reach the NSRA appointed scorer not later than the third week in October.</p> <p>The witness must be a competent person, or persons, appointed by the Rifle Association in whose area the City is located.</p>

### Conditions

Eligibility	Life, Annual & Associate Members. Concurrent National Championships are open to competitors of that nationality under NSRA Rules. Competitors in the Junior National Championships must be under the age of 18 or 16 (as indicated) on 31st December of the year of entry and Veterans must have attained the age of 60 by 31st December of the previous year.
Format	Individual competition <b>in stages</b> .
Course of Fire	<p><b>1st Stage</b> - 30 shots at 15, 20 or 25 yards or 25 metres. 30 shots at 15, 20 or 25 yards or 25 metres. The leading 200 competitors or leading 50%, whichever is less, and equal lowest scores qualify for the 2nd Stage.</p> <p><b>2nd Stage</b> - Same course as 1st Stage. Leading 20 competitors and equal lowest qualify for the final.</p> <p><b>Final</b> - 40 shots at 15, 20 or 25 yards or 25 metres.</p> <p><u>Junior Championships</u></p> <p><b>1st Stage</b> - 30 shots at 15, 20 or 25 yards or 25 metres. Leading 6 and equal lowest competitors qualify for the final in each of the four Championships.</p> <p><b>Final</b> - 30 shots at 15, 20 or 25 yards or 25 metres (shot at the same time as, or where the individual has qualified, concurrently with, the 2nd Stage above).</p>
Targets	Short Range Rifle (1510BM, 2010BM, 2510BM, 25M10BM)
Period of Shooting	<b>Winter</b> - November to April
Special Conditions	<p>The cards for each stage must be completed within a single day.</p> <p>Witness certificates are issued for each stage and all aspects must be completed. The witness must be qualified according to NSRA Rule 7.5. In the final stage, the witness must be a member of a club other than that of the competitor.</p> <p>Competitors who enter the Junior Championship will also be deemed to have entered the British Championship and the relevant Senior National Championship, and the cards will be shot concurrently in the 1st stage.</p>

Special Conditions	<p>The minimum entry for the award of trophies will be two in the Junior Championships and five in other Championships.</p> <p>Competitors who have entered the Scottish Short Range Championships (422) may shoot the competitions concurrently.</p>




